CLIFF DOCHTERMAN'S LAST ROTARY SPEECH AT NILES ROTARY ON MAY 4, 2017

As Cliff entertained us with his speech, he also passed along highlights from his experience in Rotary over these many years.

He was turned down 2 times as a prospective member for Berkeley Rotary, when he was an administrator at UC Berkeley; he was accepted the third time he was proposed. He went on to serve as club president during his 4th year in the club. After just 7 years in Rotary, Cliff served District Governor in 1968 – 1969 – John Kimber was our Niles Rotary club president during Cliff's year as DG.

In the 1970's Cliff was appointed to Rotary's new 3H committee; this was the first time Rotary had looked at Rotary service beyond the club level, and it was important that this committee be immediately successful. One of their proposals was from the Philippines – to use a vaccine to eradicate polio in the Philippines. There were 6 million children immunized in one week. Thus was born Polio Plus in Rotary International, begun in the 1986-1987 Rotary year. It was the largest humanitarian project ever done by an organization. As the project began, there were 350,000 – 400,000 cases of polio in 125 countries. There are now just 5 cases of polio thus far this year in 2 countries – Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Cliff shared some stories of his year as the President of Rotary International (1992 – 1993). The office is on a level of a head of state; Rotary has a seat in the United Nations and the president meets frequently with heads of state all over the world. He visited over 100 countries as RI President, and met heads of state from the King of Thailand to the head of Estonia, to President Clinton. In 1992 Cliff received a request for Rotarians to help out in Bosnia-Herzogovina where there was a civil war; Rotarians raised \$8 million in a short time, and saved the lives of 100,000 people that winter with the aid of food, clothing, etc. Over Cliff's 60+ years in Rotary, he has had dinner with Herb Taylor (inventor of the Four Way Test), and received the title of honorary Nigerian tribal chief.

What is important to Cliff as a Rotarian? He values the fellowship of Rotary, as well as the opportunity to serve. Cliff says that "you never know which Rotarian needs you that day", and "Never underestimate the small acts of caring," and "Little acts of friendship turn life around in a second." Cliff stated that the speech at Niles Rotary was his last Rotary speech (though gossip on the street is that he has said that recently to other Rotary clubs as well – he keeps on going!).

Centerville Free Dining Room Food Handlers Card Information

From Rose Evernden-Andrade:

As a result of a recent Health Department inspection at the Centerville Free Dining Room, all Rotarian volunteers that handle food are required to have a California Food Handler card prior to our next Feed the Hungry on March 30, 2017.

This includes all: Kitchen food handlers; Servers; Dish Washers

The only volunteers exempt for this rule are the Greeters and the person taking the Census.

Rotarians can obtain their card by going on line this month (February) to www.premierfoodsafety.com.

There is a cost of 6.99. You must create an account, sign-in and listen to the training video, which runs about 45 minutes. There is a 40 question quiz at the end that you must pass with a 70%. It is very easy and really just goes over the basics of food handling. (after February 28, the course price increases to \$15).

Once you have passed you can print your certificate and card on your home or work printer.

There is another form that needs to be signed – I will have the forms at the meeting on March 16, 2017. If you could bring a copy of your card to that meeting I will have you sign the form and turn everything into the free dining room.

ROTARIANS WITHOUT CARDS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO VOLUNTEER FOR THIS PROJECT.

If you would like assistance with this PLEASE call me – I am happy to set time up in my office and walk you through the process. I can be reached at 510-304-7703.

If you have teens, spouses or significant others that attend this project they will be required to have their card and signed document also - If you or they are not at the meeting on the 16 we can handle all issues via e-mail.
