



23 Years of the Niles Rotary Elimination Raffle History

In the early 90's a concept called an elimination raffle was beginning to become popular with nonprofits as a way to have fun, spend time with friends and make money for the nonprofit organization. A successful example was Rich Brunelli and the YMCA and Steven Lloyd with several nonprofits that benefitted the public schools and his church.

Steven Lloyd was inducted into Niles Rotary the end of 1993 at 26 years old. Within about 3-4 months with his overhead projector, black marker and transparencies in hand in the back room of Lucia's Restaurant, he began selling the club on the idea of an elimination raffle for Niles Rotary.

The big issue at hand was "is it legal???" Steven set a meeting up at the Pot Belly Deli with Dick McKay, Charlie Gallagher, and his very good friend and attorney, non-Rotarian Bruce Prescott. The meeting went well and Charlie and Dick gave it a thumbs-up!

The first ever committee meeting was at Steve Barnett's home with interested Rotarians and of course including Rich Brunelli. Rich agreed to run the raffle part of the evening and has for 22 years. Steven Lloyd's idea began to become a reality.

Steven also had a great relationship with another very creative non-Rotarian Stephen Allen whom he turned to for marketing and ticket creation. Together they began the initial marketing materials from things Steven had done in the past. The font on the ticket is still the same as it was 22 years ago and was taken from the album Guns and Roses Illusion I and II, Steven Lloyd's favorite band at the time. Bruce Prescott also wrote all the disclaimer information so that the tickets met the legal standards at the time.

Charlie Gallagher, then President-elect (PE) for Nancy Farber, worked with Steven Lloyd to kick off the first Niles Rotary Elimination Raffle and dinner event in 1996. It was held at Sunol, was fun and successful. The first year of including silent auction items was in Dave Coon's PE year in 2000. Baskets were added, silent auction items grew, and a few items were included in a live auction.

In 2002 Harry Avila approached the then President-elect Tony Boudames about auctioning off a car – Tony agreed it was a good idea and we have live auctioned several cars since including Jack Rogers' Mercedes and Marty Spellman's hotly contended for Vega just to name a few. Also 2002 year was our first attempt at basket ticket sales.

Historically we sold 500 tickets at \$100 each. In 2008, Jack Rogers' PE year, our attendance hit just over 500 people at Sunol and we knew we had to change. In 2009 with Arkady Faktorovich as PE we moved the ticket price to \$150 and lowered the tickets sales to 350. Because it has become such a fun event and space is limited to 400, in 2016 PE Rose moved the price to \$200 and decreased tickets to 325. The event has moved to the Doubletree by Hilton and continues to be quite successful in earning funds for the Niles Rotary Foundation. The Foundation then donates the funds to local nonprofit organizations through a grant system.



As of the end of November – the total raised is \$64,417!!!!

Each of the Area 3 Rotary clubs has determined the local non-profit organization that they will support. The organizations supported this year include: Tri-City Rotary Clinic, Salvation Army, Life ElderCare, New Haven Schools Foundation, Interact clubs in the tri-city area, Washington Township Museum of Local History, and the Area 3 World Community Service Committee.

Niles Rotary selected Life ElderCare for our beneficiary. Daren has gone to great effort and sacrifice to consume chili peppers at club meetings to inspire our club members to donate. He is helped by special beverages and other peppery consumables from Sophia Ahmad and Margaret Thornberry.

Centerville Free Dining Room Food Handlers Card Information

Next Feed the Hungry is March 29, 2018– you must have a food handler certificate (unless you are the door greeter or person taking census)

From Rose Evernden-Andrade:

As a result of a recent Environmental Health Department inspection at the Centerville Free Dining Room, all Rotarian volunteers that handle food are required to have a California Food Handler card to work at Feed the Hungry dinners.

This includes all: Kitchen food handlers; Servers; Dish Washers

The only volunteers exempt for this rule are the Greeters and the person taking the Census.

Rotarians can obtain their card by going on line to <u>www.premierfoodsafety.com</u>.

There is a cost for the course. You must create an account, sign-in and listen to the training video, which runs about 45 minutes. There is a 40 question quiz at the end that you must pass with a 70%. It is very easy and really just goes over the basics of food handling.

Once you have passed you can print your certificate and card on your home or work printer.

There is a form that needs to be signed. If you have not yet had the form signed, you can bring a copy of your card to Feed the Hungry, and they will have you sign the form.

ROTARIANS WITHOUT CARDS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO VOLUNTEER FOR THIS PROJECT.

If you would like assistance with this PLEASE call me – I am happy to set time up in my office and walk you through the process. I can be reached at 510-304-7703.

If you have teens, spouses or significant others that attend this project they will be required to have their card and signed document also.
